The Fate of the Wicked: Attribute Appreciation What do we learn about prayer?

- God's attributes should be recognized
- Eg. My devotions "consider my groaning

What can we be thankful for?

- God is a holy and righteous God
- "How vigorous is God in his righteousness

Worship of God: Grace-fueled Gratefulness

What do we learn about prayer?

- When we face our enemies—Satan, Sin, World—we should pray, "lead me in your righteousness"
- Begin with an inward focus

What can we be thankful for?

• Grace – the steadfast, committed, loyal love of God which gained us access to Him even though we didn't deserve it

The Fate of the Rebellious: Gritty Gratitude

What do we learn about prayer?

- What God hates we can pray against
- Praying the imprecatory psalms!

What can we be thankful for?

- Gritty gratitude
 - There are things in God's Word that are difficult to be thankful for: judgment, sovereignty, election
 - Piper: We should always approve the righteous judgments of God. When we see that God has judged a person or a people, we should approve. It is blasphemy to criticize God for his judgments. Or, to put it differently, it is blasphemy to try to be more merciful than God.
 - Let's ask God to help us understand them
 - Let's ask God to help us be thankful

Receiving from God: Bountiful Blessing

What do we learn about prayer?

• We should ask that the favourable dealings of God for his beloved (blessings of the atonement: ransom, expiation, propitiation, redemption, reconciliation) form a protective shield around us so that the evil effects of our enemies (Satan, sin, and the world) do not ruin us!

What can we be thankful for?

• We have a refuge in Christ
