Ephesians 5:20 Be filled with the Spirit ...

Giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

1 What is true, gracious thankfulness? most evil people can feel

JONATHAN EDWARDS:

- 1. True gratitude or thankfulness to God for his kindness to us, arises from a foundation laid before, of love to God for what he is in himself, whereas a natural gratitude has no such antecedent foundation. The gracious stirrings of grateful affection to God, for kindness received, always are from a stock of love already in the heart, established in the first place on other grounds... God's own excellency"
- 2. In a gracious gratitude men are affected with the attribute of God's goodness and free grace not only as they are concerned in it, or as it affects their interest, but as a part of the glory and beauty of God's nature.
 - True, gracious gratitude is not first a delight in the benefits God gives
 - True gratitude has as its foundation something else that comes first,
 namely, a delight in the beauty and excellency of God's character

What is "false" or "ungracious" thankfulness?

- If God's character, who he is, is not the foundation of our gratitude, then it is not above what the "natural man," apart from the Spirit and the new nature in Christ, experiences any person will experience this
- Our gratitude is not true, gracious gratitude if its foundation is the worth of the gift and not the excellency of the Giver
- If gratitude is not rooted in the awesome character of God before the gift, it is probably disguised idolatry

Ls putting the gift ahead of the giver

- True, gracious thankfulness is first of all thankful for who God is

3 God's character: grace

- A summation of what we can be thankful for:
- Grace God's goodness towards those who don't deserve it.
- Under all the "things" we are thankful for is the character of a God who is gracious. We delight in this! What kind of a god does good to those who don't deserve it?

G. K. CHESTERTON wrote a poem musing about God's grace to those who don't "Evening" deserve it:

Here dies another day
During which I have had eyes, ears, hands
And the great world round me;
And with tomorrow begins another.
Why am I allowed two?

4 We don't deserve God's grace

Ephesians 2:8

For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God

5 But God IS gracious so we should be thankful

• So, the foundation for our thankfulness is the foundation of God's graciousness to us. God's graciousness shines most brightly in the Gosfel of redemption

GRACE is seen most brilliantly in the Gosfel

JOHN OWEN on God's graces to us, particularly the grace of redemption:

The soul of a believer is poured out in thankful praises to him for these things, and it is sweetly affected with the duty to glorify him. There is no duty that leaves a more heavenly savor in the soul than this does.

Colossians 3:17

And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

6 Thankful for Mike

- I have not been a part of the long history of God's ministry to this church under Mike's leadership.
- I've known him a short time: Backing up a guy with cancer
- But Mike has remained thankful. God's work in his life: thankfulness!

C.S. LEWIS:

"We ought to give thanks for all fortune: if it is good, because it is good, if bad, because it works in us patience, humility and the contempt of this world and the hope of our eternal country."

- I'm thankful for Mike's thankfulness which points towards the grace of God!
- Both my thankfulness for Mike, and Mike's thankfulness in his circumstances have as their foundation the do-good-to-those-who-don'tdeserve-it character of God which we delight in!

1 Thessalonians 5:18

Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

7 So, let's be people who are thankful for who God is, and what he's done!

Spurgeon:

A child of God should be a visible beatitude [declaration of blessedness] for joy and happiness, and a living doxology [words of praise] for gratitude and adoration.
