Revelation 15:3-4 "Great and amazing are your deeds, O Lord God the Almighty! Just and true are your ways, O King of the nations! Who will not fear, O Lord, and glorify your name? For you alone are holy. All nations will come and worship you, for your righteous acts have been revealed."

3. <u>Practice</u> being bold Learn courage. Start with *little leonine steps* ... Don't be so sheepish.

Let's go ahead: let's actually do something. (It is an ideal time and place! You won't be jailed, or tortured or executed. Maybe just laughed at a bit!)

Let's do some things that require courage... strengthened by the joy of the Lord and guarded (heart and mind) by the peace of God and abounding with hope:

- b) Re-start a conversation that you have had but should have had differently
- c) Do an act of kindness that needs doing
- d) Take a stand that you have been sheepish up until now.

And while people are wondering about your boldness ("*bold as a lion*"), and maybe asking you the reason for it, (Tell them about the joy and the peace!)
